ADDITIONAL MATTERS ORDER

The Worshipful Timothy John Briden, Master of Arts Bachelor of Law Chancellor of the Diocese and Official Principal of the Bishop of Bath and Wells, having sought the advice of the Diocesan Advisory Committee, hereby makes an additional matters order, applicable to the whole Diocese in respect of the installation of cameras to record/stream worship and which will cover -

- (i) The continued use of cameras linked to a broadband installation for the recording and/or streaming of worship, where such use commenced in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- (ii) The installation of cameras for the future recording and/or streaming of worship in conjunction with a broadband facility.

These matters will require the Archdeacon's permission as if under List B and will include the following conditions:-

- (i) Details of cameras and other associated equipment, their location and the location of any cable runs are submitted to the Archdeacon when the Archdeacon is consulted on the proposal.
- (ii) Regard is had to any guidance issued by the Church Buildings Council relating to privacy and the protection of personal data.

- (iii) The location and fixings of the installations shall be agreed in consultation with the church architect or surveyor.
- (iv) Any work to an electrical installation is carried out by a person whose work is subject to an accredited certification scheme (as defined in rule 3.1 of the Faculty Jurisdiction Rules 2015).
